As the Accountable Officer of NHS Norfolk & Waveney CCG and former Accountable Officer of NHS Great Yarmouth and Waveney CCG, I am responsible for the preparation of the Mental Health Investment Standard Compliance Statement (the "Statement") for the year ended 31 March 2020 and for the financial information that forms the basis of the calculation on which the Statement is derived. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation of the Statement to ensure that mental health expenditure is correctly classified and included in the calculations and that the Statement is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

To the best of my knowledge and belief I have properly discharge my responsibilities, with regard to reporting against the Mental Health Investment Standard. NHS Great Yarmouth and Waveney CCG considers it has complied with the requirements of the MHIS for 2019/20.
